

February Block of the month: Drunkard's Path

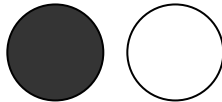
The easy version! For every 4 cut units you will get your name in once.

This block will be done in black and white only. You may use black on blacks, white on whites or solid blacks and whites. The directions will be for two squares from which you will get eight blocks total.

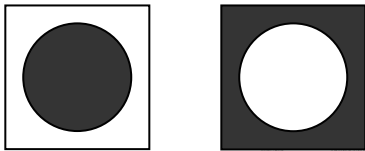
Cut one each 13" square of black and white. Fold in half, press; fold in half again and press.



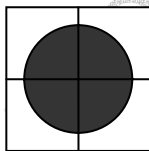
Cut 2 - 10" diameter circles of freezer paper, press the wax side of paper onto the back side of a black and a white piece of fabric. Turn under raw edge and baste. Press the circle in the same way you did the square.



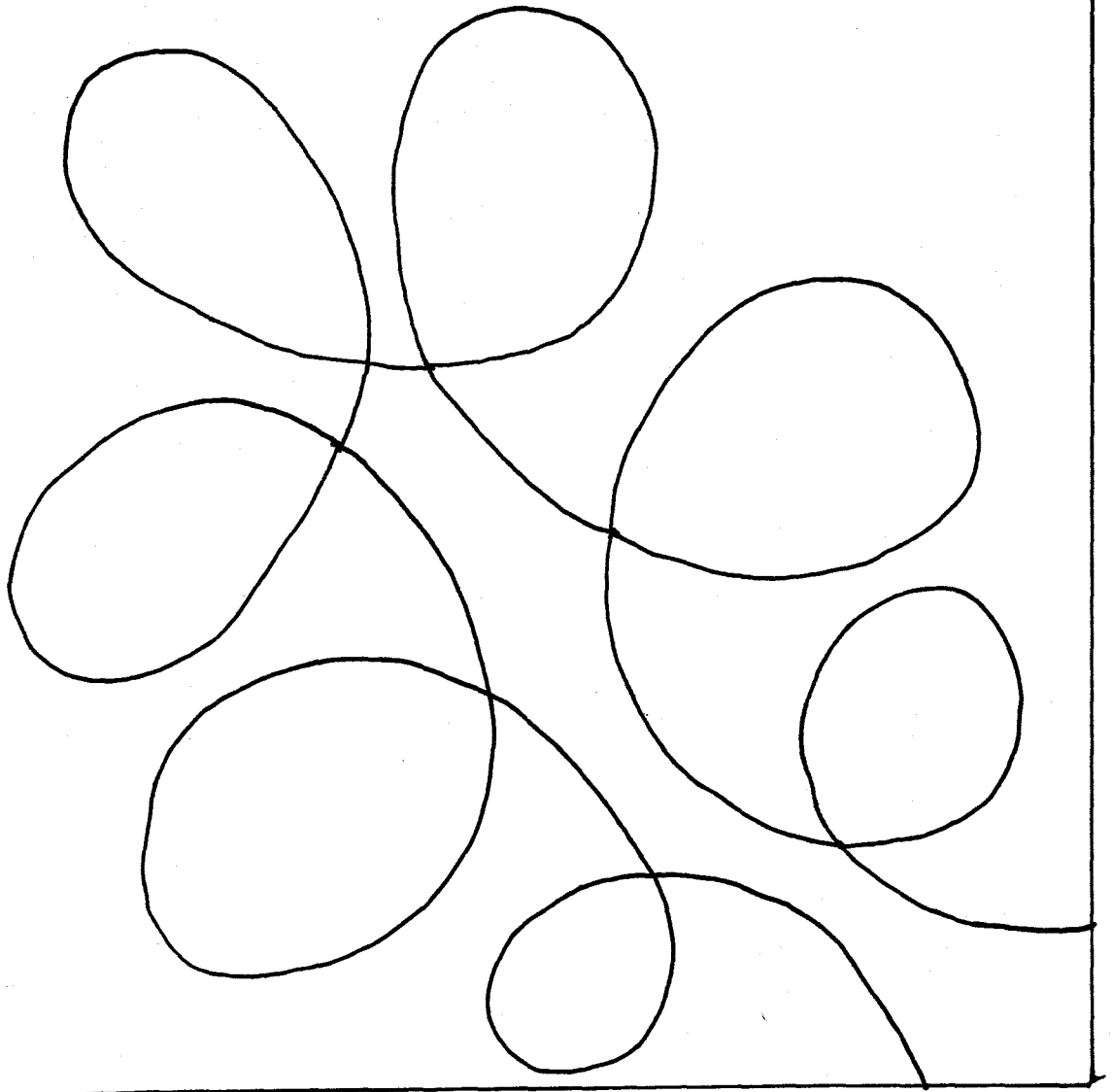
Baste the white circle to the black square using the press marks as a centering guide. Do the same for the other circle and square. Hand or machine appliqué.



Cut the finished block in half and then again in half. Remove freezer paper and trim seam allowance around the circle. You now have 4 blocks for each square and circle combination. Blocks should measure 6 1/2"
